TRAIN PD @ TCALL is a project of the <u>Texas Center for the Advancement of Literacy and Learning</u> at Texas A&M University funded by the Texas Workforce Commission to serve as the statewide Professional Development and Resource Center for Texas Adult Education and Literacy (AEL). In that role, TRAIN PD serves as the hub for the TWC AEL Training, Resource and Innovation Network for Texas (TRAIN Tex) strategy.

TRAIN PD @ TCALL is responsible for delivering training, including training-of-trainer (TOT) events, informational resources, and other support to local programs, students, and stakeholders. PD Center staff, including PD Specialists, are responsible for deploying statewide PD activities, identifying and recruiting additional contract trainers, developing and delivering training throughout the state, including online accessibility, and assisting AEL Grantees and other providers with professional development planning and services provision.

On May 18, 2013, Governor Rick Perry signed Senate Bill 307, which transferred the Adult Education system from the Texas Education Agency (TEA) to the Texas Workforce Commission (TWC). Program transfer was effective on September 1, 2013 and is reflected in Texas Labor Code Chapter 315.

Adult Education and Literacy contract management from TEA ended on August 31, 2013. Local program transition support from Texas LEARNS ended on February 28, 2014. TEAMS database management continues between TEA and TWC.

As of March 1, 2014, local support will be provided through the TWC Adult Education and Literacy department. Please consult the following contacts.





Career Pathways

This institute organizes training events, curriculum, guidance, and resources for teachers engaged in Career Pathways (CP) classes. The institute has four main components reflecting the four models of CP: Integrated Education and Training; Integrated EL Civics; Internationally Trained English Language Learner Professionals, and Workplace Literacy.

Literacy Instruction

Aligning with the definition of literacy, the goal of the Literacy PD Institute is to organize and highlight AEL research, courses and curriculum, and PD events related to Literacy, including, but not limited to, content in ABE, ASE, ELA, special learning needs, family literacy, and health literacy.

If a training topic does not fit specifically one of the other four institutes, it will be under the Literacy Instruction umbrella.

Distance Learning and Technology Integration

The Distance Learning & Technology Integration PD Institute provides evidence-based professional development for distance learning (DL), digital literacy, and the integration of educational technology. The focus of the Institute is to help educators utilize and apply technology tools, techniques and processes for facilitating learning and assessment as well as support teaching practices to improve learning outcomes.

Program Management

A PD Institute that organizes AEL research, courses and curriculum, PD events and other resources related to Program Management and Accountability. The focus of the institute is on the administration and performance of AEL programs and its goal is improving performance, increasing quality, ensuring consistency at the local, regional, and state level.

Stakeholder Integration Services

An institute focused on program and stakeholder needs with emphasis on critical PD topics centered on professionalization, recruitment, induction, orientation, and mentoring of practitioners working with WIOA customers whether the practitioner is an AEL teacher, a Workforce One-Stop intake and assessment worker, a Vocational Rehabilitation counselor, an instructor in DE or CTE, or a volunteer in a community-based literacy program.
