


Characteristics of Private Grantors


- Foundation board/funder's interests/funder's location drives the grant's intent/purpose and priorities
- Needs assessment based on facts/studies with a touch of the <u>human side/case studies</u>
- Expect <u>board members</u> to <u>contribute financially</u> to the organization
- Prefer to support a portion of project versus full project costs; may also support operational costs
- Measure <u>outcomes</u> and <u>process</u> via internal program evaluations to improve program efficacy and progress

















Project Description/Evaluation Plan
